

1. Register an account with Zotero



Don't be tempted to skip this step!

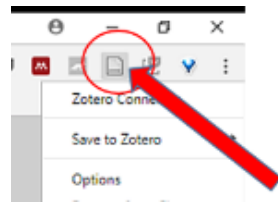
It is important to first set yourself up with an online account with Zotero, this way you can link to your online account from multiple computers and **most importantly you will have a backup for all your work**, so be sure to do this step before you even download and start using Zotero.

2. To install Zotero: Go to www.zotero.org.

Zotero works with many browsers - and will automatically recognise which browser you are using.



You will need to install both the Zotero desktop app and a browser plugin



3. Sync your Desktop app to your online Zotero account



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You must complete this step to be sure your research is backed up and accessible online.

- ▶ **Open your Zotero desktop app.** (A shortcut is automatically created on your Desktop on installation).
- ▶ Click on the **Edit** Menu – Choose Preferences – Select the **Sync** tab
- ▶ Link to your account using the username and password for your Zotero profile.



Tip: If you are unsure of your username, your email can act as your username also.
